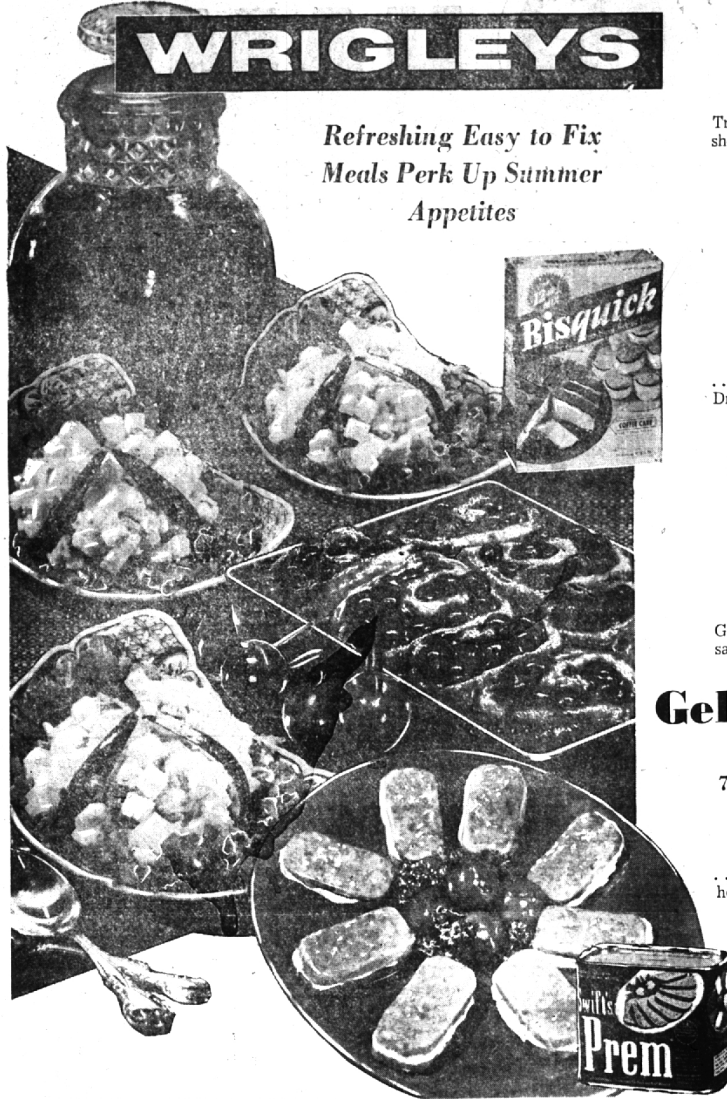
A PEARL crown secured her veil and she carried a cascade arrangement of white roses and daisies.

Notice is hereby given that any person wishing to vote at this election must register on or before July 9, 1956, at eight o'clock P.M.

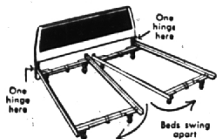

Those persons who have already registered under the permanent registration system, and have voted within the last four years, do not have to re-register.
