Localities Attend Branch ILPF's Annual Meeting

Traveling to Ann Arbor last week, to attend the annual meeting of the Michigan Branch of the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, held at the International Student Center, were Mrs. J. N. Hadjisky, Mrs. Robert Applegate, Mrs. Susan McLay, Mrs. George T. Hendrie, Mrs. Otto Enoch and Mrs. Harold Chalk.

MRS. STANLEY CAIN, formerly of Birmingham, was the featured speaker and described conditions in Brazil, where she spent a year while her husband was on leave from the University of Michigan to carry on a technical assistance program under the United Nations in Brazil.

Resolutions on the Middle East, Civil Rights field, the President passed by the membership. The Middle East resolution called upon Michigan Congressmen to support the bill asking for a peace conference of the Arab and Israel states with other interested states. In the Civil Rights field, the President was urged to call a bi-racial conference and Gov. Williams and Atty. General Thomas Kavanaugh were asked to take suitable action in cities deliberately using illegal methods to bar residential occupancy to racial and minority groups. Senators Patrick McNamara and Charles E. Potter were urged to support the Administration's request for long-term economic aid to underdeveloped countries and to provide larger appropriations for the United Nations Technical Assistance Program and for SUNFED.

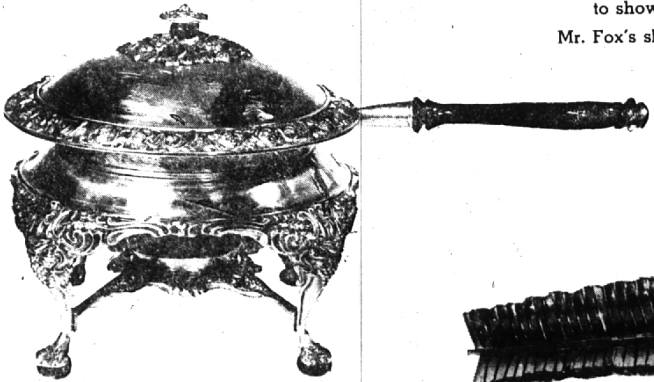
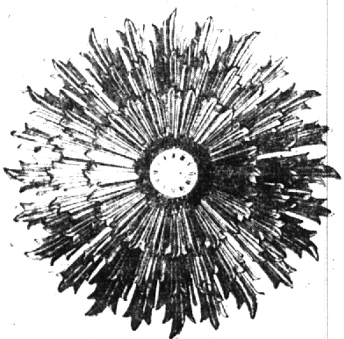
