It's a family of graduates at the Woodville home on North Williamsburg these days. Mr. and Mrs. Garwood will receive his Master's degree in metallurgical engineering.

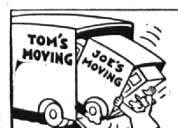
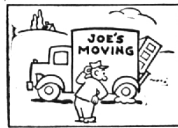
The family will straightaway travel home to attend the graduation of their daughter Maureen who will graduate from Birmingham high school the following day.
