to take notes; also have come to stand up when the teacher comes into class.

Hating mostly plays a big part in life of American boys and starts rather early for us. We start dating at the age of 12, and are not occasionally. We wouldn't know what to do—at least I wouldn't—except only to give presents worth while with girls present.

Through the separated schools we learn to feel all free when talking with girls and of course the girls don't feel better.

OUR FIRST dance to go to is our senior dance or the dance put on by the dancing-school we attend. It is a very big occasion and each boy or girl gets a new suit or dress and everyone is looking forward to it.

We have to dress up also when we visit a show. Boys appear in black suits and girls glide with their long white dresses through the halls which are mostly lit by candles.

To movies we go in everyday clothes. There are all kinds of movies over in Austria. Now very popular are war-films, then come mystery stories and then follow comedies. The seats are numbered and for different seats you have to pay different prices. My friends and I mostly sit in the front row. It is the cheapest one.

JUST WHEN I left a TV program opened and is brought during 8 hours a day. But TV is still in the developing stage and so it comes that there are not very few TV sets in the country.

A radio can be found in almost every family. I don't know if Austrian people could stand the programs which are always interrupted by commercials. In fact we include the radio if they only bring a few.

Common things of U. S. families like a record player are not very often found in an Austrian family.

THE HOLIDAYS in Austria and U. S. are about the same and only the way of celebrating is slightly different.

Christmas is the greatest holiday of the year. Weeks in advance is talked about it and everyone hides his presents until finally on Christmas Eve we take them into the living-room. In it a Christmas tree with real candles gives a festival and only to the room.

The celebration starts with the singing of Christmas carols, which is followed by unpacking of our presents and a big dinner. At midnight our family attends a mass at a nearby church.

NEW YEAR'S EVE can be celebrated whether at a dance or at home. We stay mostly home where the traditional meal is served—the head of a pig. It is supposed to be a sign of luck; also bread, salt and money should be on the table, in order not to miss it the coming year.

Earlier on Easter Rabbit comes and hides all the presents away, either in the yard or around the house. Mostly our entire family is around on hands and feet to find their presents which were hidden by my grandmother.

We don't have a holiday like Thanksgiving. Before Thanksgiving I heard many times about much much that particular day and afterward I was convinced. Even I ate so much that I wondered where I put it.

THE GREATEST holidays for students of course are the summer vacations, to which we are all looking forward to throughout the entire school year.

The cleaning of the house, the preparing of meals and the washing up to the housewife. Our family is one of the few exceptions where everyone helps. Still my mother has tremendous amounts of work for we don't have any automatic washing machines, dryers, dishwashers and so on.

The father is the boss of the family. He provides the money and so the living of the family. Children, very seldom have any money and students very seldom earn their spending money.

I AM sometimes quite amazed to see sons and daughters giving their parents lectures and telling them that they do wrong. The parents sometimes really look helpless.

Another thing I observed very often was that persons, especially teenagers even if they are very particular about their own things, don't care about the property of others.

On one of my recent visits in Northern Michigan I became aware of the fact that there is still lots of room left, most waiting to be taken up, empty light which nowhere in the European countries could be found.

U. S. is the country where if you are willing to work you have unseen opportunities and possibilities to bring yourself up, even to the presidency, like Lincoln. This is only my personal opinion.

Dr. J. Stanley Harker, president of Alma College, has announced the appointment of George A. Jacoby, director of personal services for General Motors Corporation, to the college board of trustees.

Jacoby, 245 Puritan road, Birmingham, was appointed to his present position in 1946. He devoted a year's study to American education, and recommended the General Motors grants and scholarships program as a result thereof. Commuter Service To Be Discussed By Plan Expert

Lynn D. Searcy, transportation specialist, will describe what a commuter service, utilizing existing rail facilities and modern commuter equipment, can accomplish for southeastern Michigan, in a presentation to be made at 8 p.m. Wednesday, March 7, at Huntington Woods City Hall, 11 Mile and Scotia.

Searcy will make the presentation at the invitation of the South Oakland Planning Council. He will be assisted by James Hunt of the Bodd Company.

Searcy is a member of the parking, traffic and transit sub-committee of the Detroit Tomorrow Committee, and the transportation committee of the Detroit Metropolitan Area Regional Planning Commission.

The meeting featuring films and slides, is open to the public.

Willits Widening

Winning to 37 feet of Willits from Bates to Chester was set for this coming construction season when city commission this week approved special assessment rolls calling for one payment. City forestry department will start immediately on removing 14 trees the widening will necessitate.

Manager Asks Immediate Start On 2 More Lots

City Manager D. C. Egbert this week recommended to city commissioners that they proceed immediately with plans for adding two more municipal parking lots to the one already in operation and the one now going through special assessment procedures.

Egbert said his studies show the expanded program can be financed.

IN A lengthy written review of the parking program and its financing, the manager advised immediate steps be taken to get a 68-car lot near the southwest corner of Hamilton and Hunter (Lot H-H) and a 64-car project at the northwest corner of Forest and Brownell (Lot 4-B).

His recommendation was scheduled for discussion next Monday night.

The city has in operation a 231-car lot at Pierce and Merrill, and two weeks ago necessity was determined for a 176-car facility north of Hamilton, between Park and Perdale streets.

THESE TWO, together with the proposed lot H-H, would put the city close to its half-million-dollar bonding limitation, Egbert said.

Lot 4-B, however, could be financed out of surplus parking funds, with the assistance of special assessments on benefited businesses.

Other major points the manager makes in his report are that: Parking lot No. 1 seems to be adequately located and probably will meet area needs for the next two years.

NEAR FUTURE consideration should be given to making Woodward parking parallel instead of keeping it at an angle (with loss of only 15 spaces);

Within the next two years, the city should move into the northwest business quadrant with preliminary studies and negotiations to convert existing private parking facilities into municipal ownership; and

Parking ultimately will have to be removed from Maple as the business area further develops.
