Restaurateur Dies Following Plunge

John R. Little, 29, restaurateur, died in Akron, O. Saturday of injuries received in a 15-foot fall from a hotel window the previous night.

He was found unconscious and critically injured on a rooftop beneath his fifth story room Saturday morning, when another hotel guest saw him from a window. Akron police believe he must have fallen during the night.

Little lived at 70 Devon road, Bloomfield township and was manager and secretary-treasurer of Ted's restaurant on Woodward

He was born in Pontiac, Oct. 1, 1925 and graduated from Birmingham high school and Michigan State university. He held memberships in Pine Lake Country club and Psi Upsilon fraternity.

Survivors include his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Luke M. Little; three brothers, James A., William H. and Luke M., Jr.; and his grandparents.

Funeral services were yesterday afternoon from Sparks-Griffin funeral home, Rev. Harold DeWitt of Kirk in the Hills officiated. Burial was in Ottawa Park cemetery.

C. J. BRAMMSE died March 2 in Mercy hospital, Benton Harbor, Mich., after a long illness.

A former Birmingham resident, Mr. Brammase managed the Birmingham credit bureau for a number of years here. He was a member of the Birmingham Lions club and past president of the Michigan Credit Bureau association.
