SOUTHFIELD — After a quiet week Southfield's Fire department was kept busy answering six calls Tuesday. Around six p.m. the department answered a call at 2275 Maplewood where fire had started between the walls and studs of a garage. The blaze was put out shortly and damage was reported slight. 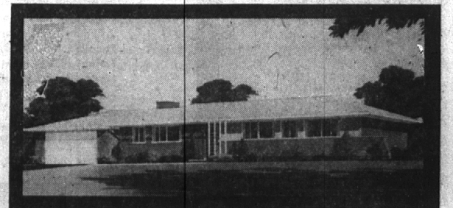
