

Three Requests Considered By Plan Board

Of three requests considered by the Birmingham plan board Tuesday night, one was approved, one denied and one put off for further study.

Recommended was a new alley behind North Woodward business frontage, between Ravine and Park streets.

DENIED was a request for a loading zone on West Maple in front of property immediately west of Kresge's. A morning loading zone would hinder the free flow of traffic on Maple and lose three parking spaces, the board noted in denying the request.

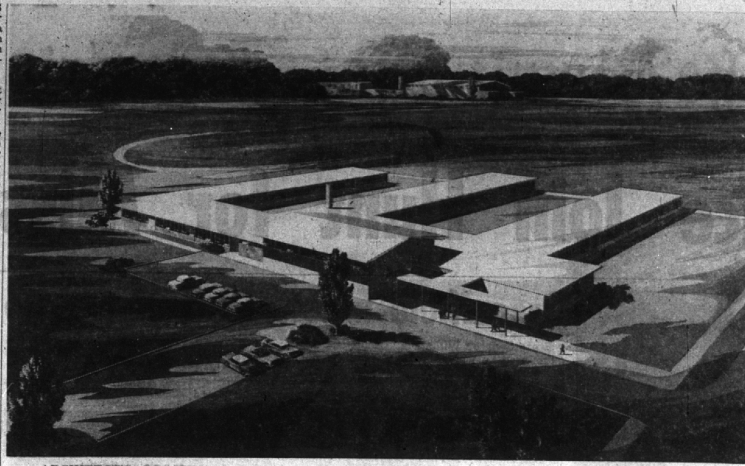
No decision was reached on a rezoning request from William Herman, owner of two parcels on North Woodward, south of the Colonial Court terrace.

PRESENTLY the front 300 feet is zoned terrace and the remainder extending back to the Rouge river is zoned single residence.

Herman plans to build a terrace development on the property if the board extends the terrace zoning to meet architects' building plans. The board put off any decision until abutting property owners are consulted at the board's April 24 committee meeting.

winning sound film was shown entitled "Children With Nephrosis" which clearly and candidly pictured this growing public health menace.

NEWLY appointed Birmingham area committees consist of Mrs. Fred J. Crockett, area chairman; Mrs. David M. Burnett, chairman of clubs and organizations; Mrs. Thomas King, chairman of special events; Mrs. Harry W. Anderson, chairman of special gifts; and Mrs. John A. Roberts, publicity.

Committees covering Bloomfield Hills, Wing Lake, Foxcroft, Franklin and other local areas will be set up in the near future.

Clawson Trio Held for 75 Area Breakins

TROY—Three Clawson youths who confessed to committing about 75 burglaries in area communities since last August, say they spent the estimated \$10,000 stolen on cars, girls and clothes.

The trio, Lawrence LePare, 20, Villip Hughes, 17, and Frederick Rendell, 18, were arrested after Ferndale police picked up Hughes two weeks ago on charges that he had been in his auto.

Hughes attempted to disguise his fingerprints with a safety pin, and when police became suspicious and questioned the youth, he broke down and implicated the other two.

Largest single amount taken was from Theodore Wreeman's home at 3581 W. Big Beaver road about \$5,000 in cash and three diamond rings. Legal papers taken were later burned, according to Troy Police Chief David E. Graptop.

Other local breakins were the Richard Jennings home at 4171 Butternut Hill; Lavern Bueche, 1145 W. Waukegan; and Harvey Macksey, 6490 Melvern.

Graptop said he has recovered the diamond rings stolen from Wreeman's home along with about \$1,000 which LePare had hidden in his home.

Hughes has already pleaded guilty in Ferndale while Rendell and Clawson police are seeking warrants for the other two. All are being held in Oakland County jail.

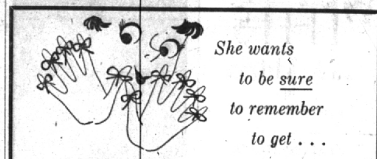
Adams School Sets Parley for Parents Of Eighth Graders
