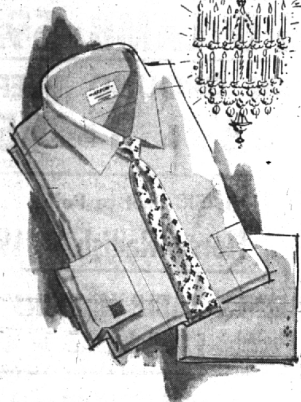

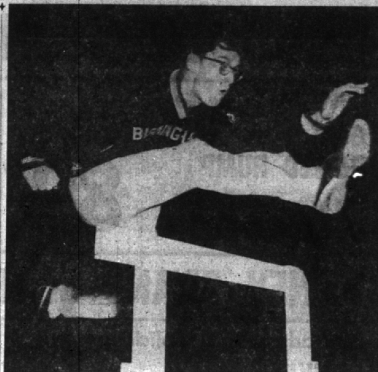

Maple Swimmers In Trial Meet

Birmingham's medley relay swimming team will compete in the United States Olympic prospect meet at the Women's City Club Saturday.

The team of Wayne Gaggie, Tom Bechtel, Jay Lewis and Pete Sintz has established the third best time in high school competition

this season and set three pool and school records.

The Maples will be the guest of John Hussey, City Club swimming coach and meet manager. The local team will compete with some of the top medley relay teams in the country.

Indoor Meet Draws Top Track Teams

A veteran Birmingham high school track team will open the season Saturday at the indoor first Huron Relays at Ypsilanti.

Coach Kermit Ambrose has entered 23 boys in the events in the new Bowen fieldhouse at Michigan State Normal college.

The Maple thinclads will be competing with some of the best schools in the state including Pontiac, Ann Arbor, Flint Northern, Lansing Eastern, Lansing Sexton, River Rouge and Ypsilanti high school.

There is no team champion or point scoring in the First Huron Relays. Medals are awarded to the first three places in each event.

Field events start at 8:30 a.m. and there is no admission charge.

Scheduled events are the 65-yard high and low hurdles, 80-yard dash, high jump, pole vault, broad jump, shot put and mile relay.

Other events are the 580-yard relay, 440-yard and mile and the sprint and distance medleys.

Ambrose rates Bob Brown just a shade behind Wuggazer in the mile event.

Joe Kidwell will handle the high and low hurdle chores for the Maples. Kidwell set a school and Pierce fieldhouse the low hurdles last year.

Pole vaulters Ron McCrimb and Bill McFarion give the Maples double-strength in that event. Both boys have cleared 11'6" in indoor workouts this year.

Howard Didier and Lynn Benn will compete in the half-mile event for the Maples this season and Mike Nordstrom, a transfer from Royal Oak, is the top prospect in the 440.

Tony Evangelista, John Appleford and Jim Macdonald are the top dashmen on the team. Tim Schmitt and Macdonald will handle the broad jump.

Chuck Gibson will be a strong shot put for the school record in that event this season. As a freshman last year, Gibson tossed the 12-pound shot over 49 feet.

WITH such an array of talent on hand, Ambrose, starting his fifth year as Birmingham track coach, is looking forward to his most successful season.

After the Huron Relays the Maple thinclads will be idle until the start of the outdoor dual-meet season, Birmingham will host Waterloo in the opener, April 20.
