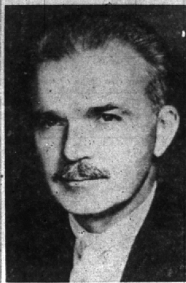


Minninger Qualifies For Presidents' Club

Maguire, Oros Named To New Ford Positions

Realignment and expansion of Ford-Motor Co.'s advanced styling activities have been announced by George W. Walker, Woodberry road, Bloomfield Hills, vice president and director of styling.

WALKER said the realignment and expansion represent a "completely new and dynamic concept of advanced styling designed to assure even greater success for Ford Motor Co. products in the market place of the future."

"This expansion," he said, "will comprehend advanced styling research cars, studies of tooling and manufacturing relationships, and more centralized development and coordination of basic advanced styling."

MAGUIRE, a native of New York City, has been an industrial designer since 1929 and has been with Ford since September, 1947. He had headed the Ford styling studio since December, 1949. He previously spent 10 years as an industrial designer in the New York area and three years as a stylist for General Motors Corporation. Before entering the Air Force in 1942, he was in charge of interior styling for all General Motors cars. He attended the National Academy of Design and the Art Students' League in New York, and studied architecture at Syracuse University.

OROS joined Ford in June, 1955, after 19 years with an independent industrial design firm headed by Walker prior to the latter's appointment as vice president and director of styling. He previously was with General Motors Corporation for six years.

A native of Cleveland, Oros graduated from Cleveland East Technical high school in 1935 and majored in design at the Cleveland School of Art, from which he was graduated in 1939. Later design studies in Europe were interrupted by the war.
