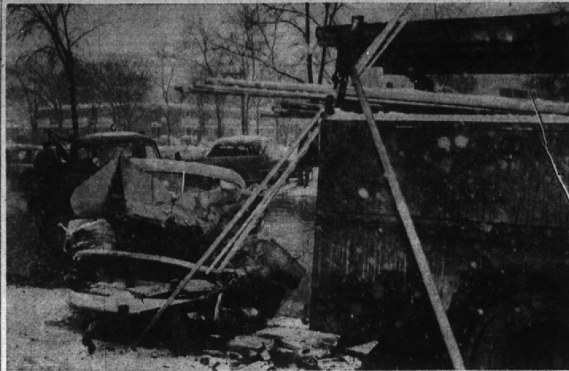

Post Article Co-Authored By Local Man

A Birmingham advertising man's research into a client's industrial history led to a historical find revealed this week in a Saturday Evening Post story. "Abe and His Secret Weapon" tells the story of Lincoln's part in furnishing northern troops a seven-shot repeating rifle which helped cut short the Civil War.

J. L. Buckeridge, 9 Ravine road, discovered the story when he researched for an advertising booklet to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the first automatic screw machine. The local advertising man, in preparing the booklet for Perry-Fay company, Elyria, O., screw machine manufacturers found the inventor of the automatic screw machine also invented the first basic repeating rifle. Going through hundreds of Civil War soldier memoirs, Buckeridge hit upon a rich lode when he found evidence that Christopher Spencer's repeating rifle was a major factor in winding up the muzzle-loader Civil War. Buckeridge recorded the evidence, along with the seven-shooting experiences of over 50 Northern regiments, in a book entitled "Lincoln's Choice", scheduled for spring publication by Stackpole company, Harrisburg, Pa.
