

8 County Hospitals Fully Licensed For Maternity Care

In Oakland county, eight hospitals are among 238 in the state which are fully licensed to provide maternity care, the Michigan Department of Health reported today. Area hospitals fully licensed are: St. Joseph Mercy hospital, Pontiac; Ardmore hospital, Ferndale; Avon Center hospital, Rochester; William Beaumont hospital, Royal Oak; Bloomfield hospital, Pontiac; Helene Meinke hospital, Hazel Park; Pontiac General hospital, Pontiac; and Pontiac Osteopathic hospital, Pontiac.

Dr. Albert E. Heusla, State Health Commissioner, released the list of fully-licensed hospitals as a sign of the "significant strides forward toward giving the very best medical care to our new babies and their mothers."

THREE years ago, he said, only 143 Michigan hospitals were on the fully approved list; a year later, 195 had qualified; and the number fully licensed now stands at 238.

The Commissioner gave high praise to hospital personnel, and said that "for the most part, the hospitals have been the first to give wholehearted and enthusiastic support to the licensing program."

The Commissioner's report showed that the 238 Michigan hospitals now holding full licenses have a total of 5,921 maternity beds.

TODAY, he said, qualifications must be held by the 238 hospitals and 93 regulations as "musts" and 44 provisions which the hospitals must all observe in "immediate future plans."

Included under the standards, the report concluded, are equipment for care of mothers and newborn infants, formula preparation, record-keeping, control of anaesthetics, nursing techniques, baby identification and even the hospital plumbing system.

Advices 33-Foot Width for Eton

It would be safer to have a 33-foot Eton pavement than one two feet narrower, Birmingham City Manager D. C. Egbert told the commission Monday night.

So with some hesitation, commissioners reconsidered action at a March 22 hearing when they tabled the necessity of widening Eton from Lincoln to Yosemite. This will permit preparation of new cost estimates.

Only seven days before, commission had listened to a packed house when Egbert, who explained it would not add to residential property assessments.

A 40-FOOT width, originally considered, was reduced to 31 feet for two traffic lanes and a parking strip along the west side.

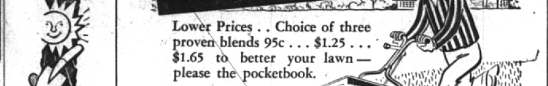
