3rd Tax Schedule Added for Couples Filing Jointly

If you have read your instruction booklet, A. M. Menninger, Detroit district director of the Internal Revenue Service stated, you will find on page 14 that there now are three tax rate schedules instead of two shown in 1954.

This extra schedule (which is the one in the center) was designed for married people filing a joint return and certain surviving spouses to eliminate the necessity of their having to compute their tax on a split income basis.

The three schedules are: Schedule I for individuals and married people filing separate returns.

Schedule II for married persons filing a joint return and certain widows and widowers.

SCHEDULE III for individuals who are unmarried or legally separated qualifying as head of household.

Menninger indicated some of the common mistakes made by taxpayers are failure to print or write legibly, forgetting to sign, not reporting all income, and mistakes in arithmetic.

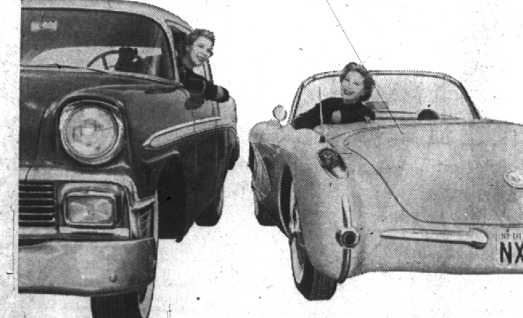

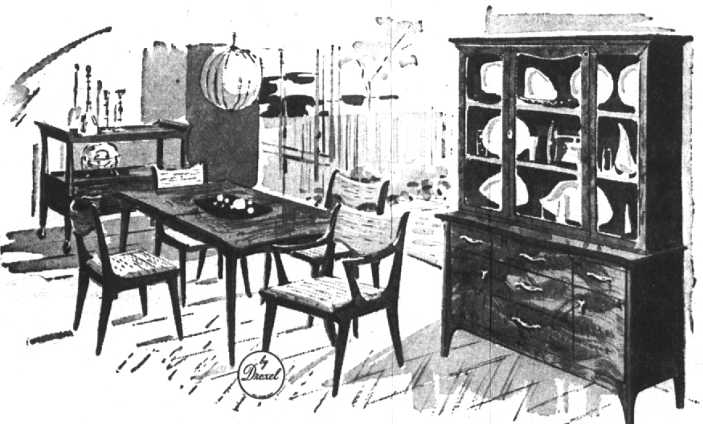
