

### \$17.80 Tax Rate Proposed in Hills -

**BLOOMFIELD HILLS** — Proposed budget for 1956-57 is set at \$193,000, which means a \$17.80 per thousand of assessed valuation to city taxpayers.

This is an increase of \$1 a thousand over last year's \$17,500 budget, according to City Manager Elmer Kephart.

"Most of the increase is going for road improvements," Kephart said. "I think the primary need now, outside of the Evergreen incinerator sewer, is improvement of our roads."

To aid in this project, the proposed expenditures include addition of one man to the road department, Kephart said.

A public hearing will be held May 28 at the city offices. Chart calls for budget adoption before May 31.

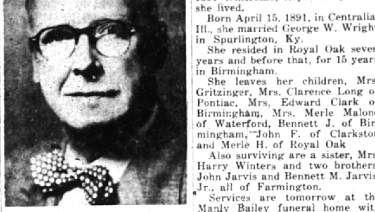
Born April 15, 1891, in Centralia, Ill., she married George W. Wright in Springfield, Ky.
