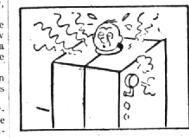

St. James Church Choir to Present Oratorio 'Elijah'

The choir of St. James church will present the oratorio "Elijah" by Mendelssohn Sunday at 11 a.m. services. Kent McDonald, organist and choirmaster will direct.

The difficult solo role of Elijah will be sung by George Mullin, baritone. Other soloists will be Nioma Sherman, soprano; Marie Wilson, contralto; Neil Soper, tenor.

The choir will present part one of the oratorio which relates how the prophet Elijah came as a drought in Israel because its people have forsaken the Lord.

The oratorio "Elijah" follows in line the great classical oratorios of Handel and Haydn.

In discussing the work, choirmaster McDonald said, "As in the oratorios of Handel, the most important role is allotted to the chorists which expresses the exclamations of the people or the crowd."

The wealth of musical inspiration as expressed through the chorists not only through the lyrically contemplative passages but also in the dramatically thrilling scenes, make this work probably without rival in the oratorio literature of all ages," McDonald added.

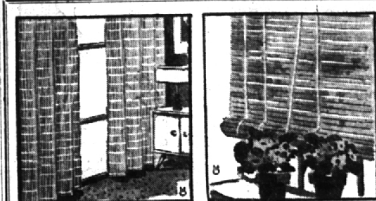

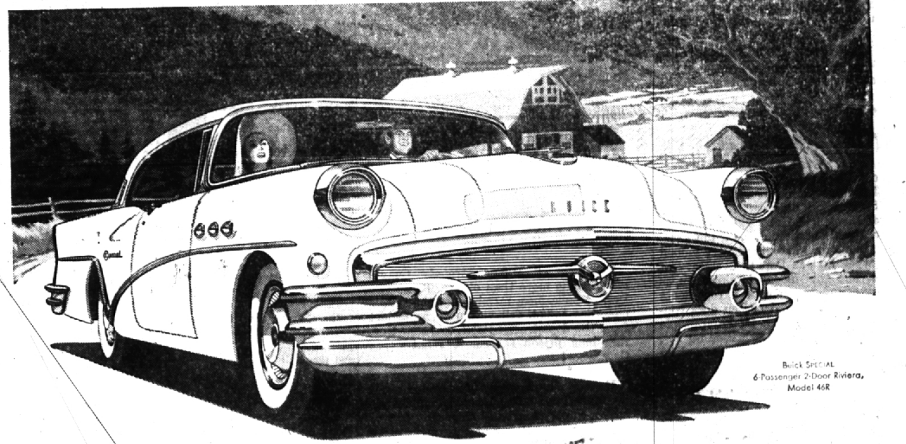
