Plan ERO District Along 14 Mile Rd.

SOUTHFIELD — Intention to rezone Lots 1 through 31 in Eco City subdivision on 14 Mile between Pierce and Edgewood, from R-2 to ERO was declared Tuesday by township board.

M. D. Van Wagener and Hawthorne Developing Co., owners of the lots, have agreed to give Peace Lutheran Ascension church's parking lot and give them a playground at Pierce and Birwood in exchange for use of church parking lot for the development which will be office buildings, a dental and medical clinic and a savings and loan association.

A public hearing will be held on the rezoning, and the township board hopes to have on hand an ERO-1 classification to fit the development.

ERO-1 would require no set back, parking lots no closer than 10 feet to the buildings, a 10-foot greenbelt, and no side yards.


