Poppy Day Slated

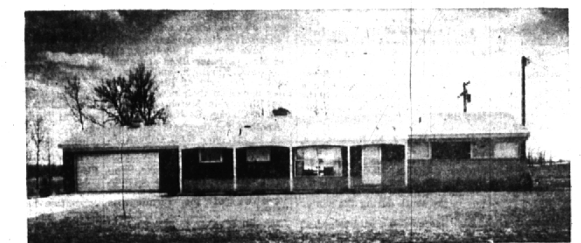
