

**Plans Won't Change, Oil Co. Reassured**

Tentative approval of arrangements regarding annexation, development, and use of a triangle of land at Hunter and N. Woodward was secured this week from Birmingham city commission.

The land now is in Bloomfield township, and a gas station is being erected on it. The agreement assures the oil company that present plans will not be changed after annexation.

Abutting this station to the south is the new right-of-way for extending Oak street through to Hunter. The oil company is cooperating with the city to obtain this street extension.

**Getting Ready To Confirm Assessments**

Three May 28 assessment roll confirmation hearings were scheduled this week by the Birmingham city commission.

One concerns additional right-of-way for Park and Ferradale streets onto Hamilton, the second for paving of these two streets between Hamilton and Oakland.

The third hearing is for paving Holland east from Eton.

The Park street projects may not be completed for a year or so if a contemplated city condemnation suit meets much resistance, said City Manager D. C. Egbert.

Owner John W. Gaffill claims his property is worth almost double what the city has had it appraised for.

EGBERT ALSO was authorized to finalize negotiations with The Birmingham Eccentric for four lots, at a cost of \$48,570, which are to be part of a 175-car parking lot north of Hamilton.

Also staged was payment for a \$5,905 Hamilton alley right-of-way.

Several property residential owners, whose homes are to be taken for the parking lot also are expected to resist city condemnation action in order to get what they believe are more equitable prices, one owner said this week.
