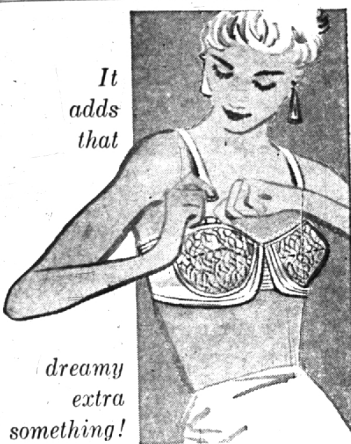


Mary Burkman OK'd For Girls' State
