Democrats Are Monied, Too, Reminds Feikens

"The Democrat Party in Michigan is run by a club of insincere millionaires," Republican Chairman John Feikens said in a speech to over 100 members of the Birmingham-Bloomfield Republican Club Tuesday night.

Speaking at the Community House, Feikens said: "The Democrat leadership in Michigan delights in calling Republicans the party of 'big money' and a bunch of 'coupon clippers.' But who are these Democrat leaders?"

"There is Mr. Williams... a millionaire. There is Mr. Staebler... a millionaire. These millionaires with a holier-than-thou attitude go around the state attacking the very institutions upon which their own great wealth is based. They must have a job to do."

"THE DEMOCRATS have the money and the millionaires for the 1956 campaign. We'll compare financial statements with them any time—if they're honest about it."

"In 1964, the Democrat State Central Committee reported spending \$85,000. We spent \$450,000—and wound up with a deficit."

"IT IS astonishing to us," Feikens continued, "that union leaders would spend such huge sums of money with such bitter animosity toward the Eisenhower administration which has, in just three and a half years, largely solved the economic, social and problems of security that were created and ignored by the Democrats for over twenty years."

Michigan, he stated, is looking upon as a key state in the coming national and state elections, and he urged every Republican to work in his back yard and his precinct for a sweeping Republican victory in November.

Mr. C. Comelant, club president, said the next meeting is Tuesday, July 17, at the Birmingham Community House. Principal speakers will be George N. Higgins, William S. Bloomfield and Claude E. Sadler, candidates for nomination as Republican candidate for representative from the 18th congressional district.

All followed as closely as possible United Nations procedure, guided by a steering committee composed of Bob Galbreath, Don Laird, Ann Gardner, Ann Knightly, Kam Hagan, Kitty Wilson and the instructor, Hugh Wilkof.

WILKOFF AND the six students on the steering committee attended a mock United Nations assembly held for the seventh year at Hilldale college last month.

20 Resolutions Are Rescinded; To Start Over

Twenty commission resolutions involved in the opening, widening and paving of Ferrandale and Park streets were rescinded Monday night to clear the record for a new start.

Commissioners accepted City Manager D. C. Egbert's suggestion that this new beginning would permit city to consider—and perhaps adopt—a larger assessment district to finance the two projects.

Commissioners also rescinded certain residential corner lots, and increase the proposed city's share of 15 per cent of the cost.

They also cancelled a May 28 hearing on the confirmation of the original assessment roll.
