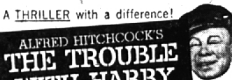

Academy of Art Show Opens At Cranbrook

CRANBROOK — The 1956 annual exhibition of student work opens to the public on Saturday, May 26, following a Friday evening preview, at Cranbrook Academy of Art galleries, Wallace Mitchell galleries head has announced.

Designed by Theodore Luderovsk, head of the design department, the exhibition includes paintings, sculpture, weaving, ceramics, metalworking, architectural models and renderings, and more furniture than usual. A model living room and terrace has been constructed to show some of the furniture, and a long black and white construction makes a background for more furniture by students of design. The Friday evening invitational preview follows a day of commencement ceremonies for the 27 graduating students at Cranbrook Academy of Art. Zoltan Sepesby, academy director, will confer master of fine arts degrees on 20 students, master of architecture degree on five, and two bachelor of fine arts degrees.

The 27 graduates will be honored by a commencement dinner at Cranbrook House, attended by academy faculty and trustees.
