Country Day School Plans Carnival For Father's Day

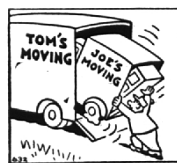
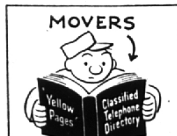
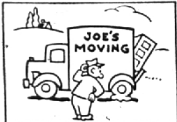
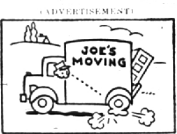
