BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP
ORDINANCE NO. 4
BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP MOTOR VEHICLE ORDINANCE
THE TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD ORDINANCE
Section 1. This ordinance shall be known as the Township Motor Vehicle Ordinance of Bloomfield Township, Oakland County, Michigan.
Section 2. Whereas it is the desire of the Township Board to enact an ordinance for the regulation of the use and operation of Motor vehicles within the township, and whereas the Michigan Vehicle Code contains all of the regulations designed to control vehicular traffic and use of motor vehicles which would be appropriate for the township, and therefore it is ordained that said Michigan Vehicle Code and all amendments thereto, from a hereafter made, are incorporated in this ordinance by reference therein so far as the same apply to the operation, control and use of vehicles on the streets, alleys and highways of Bloomfield Township.
Section 3. Compliance for violations of this ordinance shall be made by writing describing the offense committed and shall refer to the section number of the section of the Michigan Vehicle Code which describes the offense committed, as being the section number of this ordinance as though the same were herein written.
Section 4. Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$100.00 and costs of prosecution or in default thereof by imprisonment in the county jail for not to exceed 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.
Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after the same shall be published as required by law. Made and passed by the Bloomfield Township Board the 14th day of May, A.D. 1956.
