 TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN. AMENDMENT NO. 3 TO BUILDING CODE ORDINANCE NO. 31. THE TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN, HAS ADOPTED AT THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TOWNSHIP BOARD HELD MAY 15, 1956, THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENT TO THE BUILDING CODE AS AMENDED BY ADDING A NEW SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 10-1-1-1 HEREIN:

1. The Township Board of the Township of Bloomfield is hereby granted full authority to determine, define and designate the central area in the Township of Bloomfield, where existing, or to be hereafter, down spouts, paths and house gutters, and other structural devices for the channeling of rain water from structures, shall not hereafter be subjected to any sewer, either direct or indirect.
