Northminster Church's First Services Sunday

The first services in the new Northminster Presbyterian church will be held Sunday, May 6. The first unit of the structure, on Big Beaver road near Adams road on the outskirts of Birmingham, has just been completed. The \$65,000 structure, designed along contemporary lines by Birmingham architect Alton Smith, AIA, is only a small segment of the building planned for this site. COMPLETED FACILITIES will include a chapel, with a seating capacity for 104, three large Sunday school rooms, the pastor's study and a kitchen. Northminster's pastor is the Rev. Mackay Taylor, a graduate of the College of Wooster in Wooster, O., and the McCormick Theological seminary. Mr. Taylor came to Birmingham to establish a Presbyterian church a year and a half ago. For a few months the congregation worshipped in the minister's garage at 2588 Windemere road. Since that time the congregation has had the use of Poppleton school in Troy township for Sunday services. NORTHMINSTER Presbyterian church was formally organized on June 5, 1955, with a charter membership roll of 71. Membership now approximates 120, and in the rapidly growing community plans are under way to schedule two Sunday morning services. The official building dedication will be held the afternoon of June 3. Prominent ministers from the Detroit Presbytery will conduct the ceremony. Local business and community leaders will be invited to attend.
