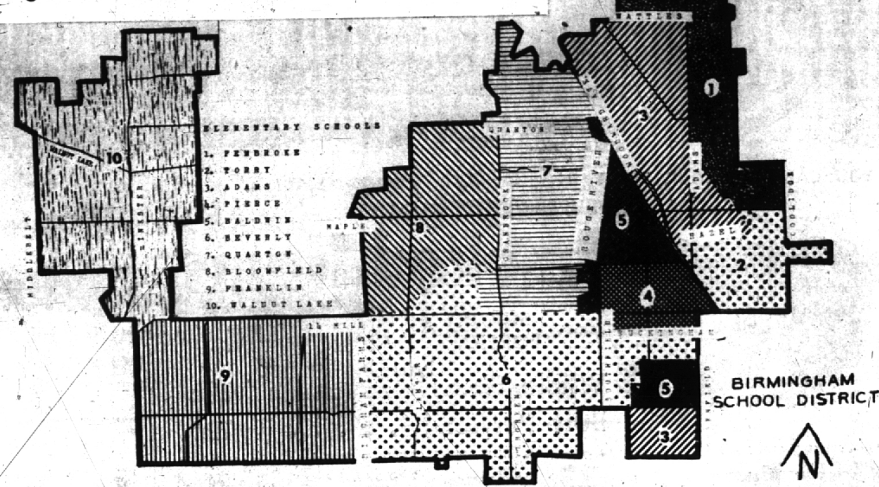


# Attendance Areas for Birmingham Grade Schools

Pupils from kindergarten through 6th grade will attend the school indicated by number in the area they live. All students in grades seven through nine living within the city limits, west of Woodward, and those in the area bounded by South-

field, 13 Mile road, the school district boundaries. Greenfield and the city of Birmingham will attend Barnum Junior high school. All other junior high students will attend the new Derby Junior high school. All students in grades 10 through 12 living in the school district will attend Birmingham high school.

### Eton Widening Stays at 33 Ft.

Eton road will be widened only to 33 feet from Lincoln to Yosemite, the Birmingham commission decided by a 4-3 vote Mon. night. The rail now goes to the assessor for spread of assessments, to be followed by a hearing on the project's confirmation. Commissioners Florence Willett, James Allen, Harry Denyes and William Roberts voted to add only an east side parking lane to the widening of the present two traffic lanes. All but a few industrial property owners protested the widening need, but residential owners endorsed it primarily as a means of improving the street's appearance.

### Were Delegates At Convention

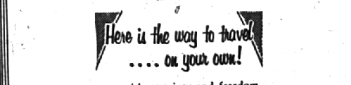
