

Two More Enter 18th Dist. Race

Two more entries in the 18th congressional district race were announced this week.

Seeking the GOP nomination will be Claude E. Sadler, of Royal Oak, newspaper linotype operator and former editor.

Out for the Democratic nomination is Charles K. Lawson, of Hazel Park, an inspector at Ford's Highland Park tractor plant.

Democrat's other candidates are Paul Sutton of Royal Oak, who won the party's 1934 nomination; Gilbert H. Davis of Royal Oak; Zigmund J. Niparko of Hazel Park, and Arthur J. Law of Pontiac.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT Township Board of Southfield Township has intended and hereby declares its intention to amend Ordinance No. 135 in the following respects:

Section 4-M-1
A food stand is defined to be a space and within a permanent structure, where fruit, vegetables and other food products are sold.

Section 4-M-2
A building is defined to be a temporary building, tent or other structure, erected on a lot, whether or not a combination of the following located in a street or other public place, where part or all the customers are outside the structure, where fruit, vegetables, or other agricultural products are sold or stored.

Section 15 changed to read as follows:

Section 15-A
It shall be unlawful to expose for sale in open receptacles or in broken packages, fruits or farm products within a building unless the same shall be kept in bins, crates, tubs, boxes, or other receptacles, where the same are exposed for sale.

Section 15-B
It shall be unlawful to expose for sale in open receptacles or broken packages, vegetables, fruits or farm products within a building unless the same shall be kept in bins, crates, tubs, boxes, or other receptacles, where the same are exposed for sale.

Section 22 changed to read as follows:

Section 22
The following shall be the minimum building and equipment requirements for the Township of Southfield several days in removal of refuse:
