Concomitant with late May is CRABGRASS. It is a nasty pest but is not too difficult to control if you will give it as thoughtful attention as you would to mixing zee perfect martini. Pay attention to the rules. Remember that whatever you do a few plants will probably survive . . . just as sometimes there will be one tiny bone in your file of sole or 2 or 3 huckleberries with STEMS ON at breakfast.

If the plants appear in your lawn dig them out or spray them with CRAB-NOT. Also plan to eliminate most of them as they germinate by applying CHLORDANE (8%) to the soil surface at the rate of ONE PINT TO 2000 SQ. FT. Do this 1 to 5 weeks AFTER you have reseeded and do it even though some c. g. plants are already showing.

Should, perchance, you want some lovely blooms to grace your garden or home later on get busy with:— DELPHINIUM PLANTS (\$1.95 each) PERUVIAN DAFFODILS PEONY ROOTS PEACOCK ORCHIDS DAILIAS GLADIOLUS & ODDS & ENDS

We must admit we cannot arrange to make deliveries at your home during the fifteen minute interval between depositing junior at home and leaving for a tea party. 25c and 50c deliveries and charges are a drain on our good humour. We will cooperate when possible . . . will you?

RANDOM NOTES

Peonies need plenty of H₂O plus some GARDEN-GRO or AGRICO 5-10-5. For large peony blooms pick off all the side buds. Sow nearly all flower seeds now:—

- FERRY-MORSE
- MANDEVILLE & KING
- VAUGHAN
- BURPEE

Before planting GLADIOLUS soak the corms for 30 minutes in a solution of 2 tablespoonfuls of LYSOL to 1 gallon of water. (Immediate planting after soaking is not necessary.) Dust at 10 day intervals with 3% DDT (NEW DUST) after plants appear.

Plant RUTABAGA if you dare. Divide Shasta Daisies at this time.

Chrysanthemums and women will be helped by judicious pinching. Keep on pinching until the middle of July and then beat it to the fishing pond.

Dust or spray hollyhocks, phlox, delphinium regularly with SULPHUR, FERMATE CAPTAN or BORDEAUX.

Be sure to snip off daffodil and tulip blooms as soon as they fade. Leave the stem and leaves to form new bulbs.

Now that the drought is on check your KOROSEAL, HOSE, SPRINKLERS, LEAKS, etc. so you will be ready. Try a HAYES SPRAY GUN if you want to simplify your bug and weed problems.
