Science Group To Lease Church In Franklin

Arrangements have been completed for the new Christian Science society of Franklin to use the present building of the Franklin community center. For the effort moves to a new church under present ownership.

Since the organization on April 17 last year, the Christian Science group has met at the Franklin Community Hall.

The Franklin Community church is one of the oldest in the area, organized in 1820. Its congregation has worshipping continuity of 75

The steadily increasing size of its membership and inability to acquire additional land to expand its historic building forced its move to the new location.

Edward J. Green, chairman of its board of trustees, said the board was particularly happy about the arrangement made with the Christian Science group, because it will continue the 25 years of individual use of the building for religious worship.

Arrangements announced by the two groups provided for a one year "rentable" lease, with an option to purchase at any time during the period.

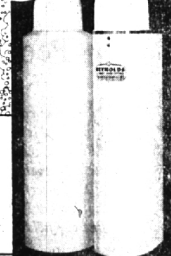
