**Secy. of State Branch Office Incident Closed**

Deputy Secretary of State Sidney M. Woolner said Tuesday he has closed his investigation of reported irregularities in handling of used car sales taxes here, attributing the whole thing to a possible misunderstanding. Earlier in the week, he had announced he would check into the complaint of Evan B. Hanay, 884 Rivewood, Birmingham, that a clerk in the local secretary of state's branch office had been "sloppy" and "unbusinesslike" in handling a used car sales tax transaction. "I have completed my investigation, and find any suspicion of irregularities is absolutely groundless," Woolner told The Birmingham Eccentric.

HE SAID the clerk merely was trying to make it clear that the used car tax must be paid, and that both clerk and the car buyer understood it that way. Hanay, who was selling the car, had written the secretary of state reporting the clerk had done some "careless" joking while the transaction was being made. Woolner said he was satisfied the business was properly handled. "If anything, it was a misunderstanding," he added.

**Gets Probation**

Placed on two years' probation after pleading guilty to charges of larceny from a building, Mrs. Edna Jackson, 23, was also ordered Monday by Oakland county circuit judge H. Russel Holland to pay \$100 in costs and make restitution of \$150. Birmingham police said Mrs. Jackson took items valued at \$720 from the Lawrence Falvey home at 517 Kimberley.
