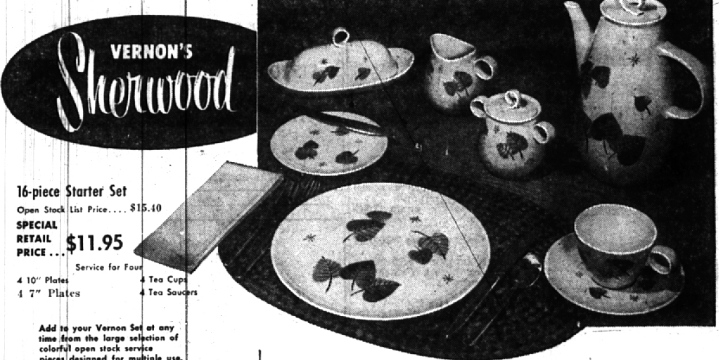
SALE OF FRAME HOUSE

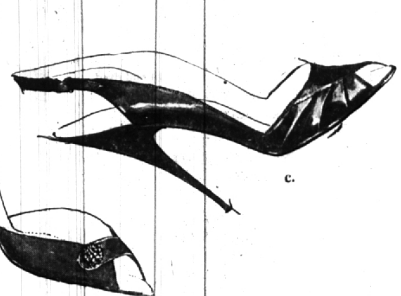
