

## Here's Where You Vote on Nov. 6

Since many newcomers have moved into the Birmingham area since the last presidential election in 1952, The Eccentric would like to review the precinct polling stations and boundaries in the various communities so voters may more easily find their way to the polls Nov. 6.

### Birmingham

**Precinct No. 1—Chesterfield Polling place at Fire Station**  
Bounded on the north, by city limits; east, by River Rouge and Quarton Lake; south, by West Maple Avenue, west, by city limits

**Precinct No. 2—Polling Place at Holy Name School, Corner of Harmon and Greenwood, Greenwood Entrance.**  
Bounded on the north, by city limits; east, by Woodward Avenue; south, by West Maple Avenue; west, by River Rouge and Quarton Lake

**Precinct No. 3—Polling Place at Adams School, Corner Oakland and Worth**  
Bounded on the north, by city limits; east, by G.T.W.-R.R., Adams Rd. and north city limits; south, by East Maple Avenue; west, by Woodward Avenue

**Precinct No. 4—Polling Place at Municipal Building, 151 Martin Street**  
Bounded on the north, by West Maple Avenue; east, by Woodward Avenue; south, by Frank Street; west, by River Rouge

**Precinct No. 5—Polling Place at Barnum School**  
Bounded on the north, by Frank Street; east, by Woodward Avenue; south, by Lincoln Avenue; west, by River Rouge

**Precinct No. 6—Polling Place at Adams Fire Station**  
Bounded on the north, by East Maple Avenue; east, by city limits; south, by Lincoln Avenue; west, by Woodward Avenue

**Precinct No. 7—Polling Place at Grand Trunk Station, 245 Eton Road**  
Bounded on the north, by city limits; east, by city limits; south, by East Maple Avenue; west, by Grand Trunk Western Railroad

**Precinct No. 8—Polling Place at Birmingham High School, Corner West Lincoln and Cranbrook, Main Lobby Entrance on West Lincoln**  
Bounded on the north, by West Maple Avenue; east, by River Rouge; south, by city limits; west, by city limits (Cranbrook Road)

**Precinct No. 9—Polling Place at Pierce School.**  
Bounded on the north, by Lincoln Avenue; east, by Pierce Street; south, by Fourteen Mile Road; west, by River Rouge

**Precinct No. 10—Polling Place at Y.M.C.A., 400 East Lincoln**  
Bounded on the north, by Lincoln Avenue; east, by Woodward Avenue; south, by Fourteen Mile Road; west, by Pierce Street

**Precinct No. 11—Polling at Torry School, 1658 E. Lincoln, Corner of Torry**  
Bounded on the north, by Lincoln Avenue; east, by city limits; south, by Fourteen Mile Road; west, by Woodward Avenue

### Southfield

**Precinct No. 1—Polling Station: Brooks School, 11 Mile and Lahser**  
Bounded on the north, by Franklin and Bingham Farms Village and 12 1/2 Mile road, east: Evergreen road south to Lathrup Village limits, then follows city limits to 10 1/2 Mile road, south: 11 Mile road to Northwestern, Northwestern to Lahser, Lahser to 10 1/2 Mile and 10 1/2 Mile to Lathrup Village limits, west: by Inkster road.

**Precinct No. 2—Polling Station: John Grace school, 21030 Indian road**  
Bounded on the north: By Rouge River from Inkster to Eight Mile, south: by Eight Mile, west: by Inkster road.

**Precinct No. 3—Polling Station: Ascension Lutheran church, 14 Mile road**  
Bounded on the north, by 14 Mile road; east, by Greenfield; south, by Beverly; west, by Southfield

**Precinct No. 4—Polling Station: McKinley school, 10 Mile and Southfield**  
Bounded on the north, by 10 1/2 Mile; east, by Greenfield road; south, by Nine Mile to Evergreen, Evergreen to 9 1/2 Mile line, and 9 1/2 Mile line to the middle of Section 27; west, by a line halfway between Evergreen and Lahser roads to the 9 1/2 Mile line, and from the 9 1/2 Mile line to Evergreen road, then south along Evergreen to Nine Mile road.

**Precinct No. 5—Polling Station: Franklin Community Hall, 32707 Franklin road**  
Includes all of Franklin Village and Bingham Farms Village

**Precinct No. 6—Polling Station: Brace school, 21705 Evergreen road**  
Bounded on the north: by Nine Mile from Prescott to western boundary of Duns Scotus College grounds, thence due north to the 9 1/2 Mile line, thence east to Evergreen, south on Evergreen to Nine Mile, and Nine Mile east to a line halfway between Evergreen and Southfield roads, east: by a line halfway between Evergreen

and Southfield running north and south from Eight Mile to Nine Mile, thence west along Nine Mile to Evergreen, thence north along Evergreen to a line halfway between Nine and 10 Mile roads, south: by Eight Mile road, west: by Prescott between Eight and Nine Mile roads, thence east along Nine Mile to the western boundary of Duns Scotus college, thence north to the line halfway between Nine and 10 Mile roads

**Precinct No. 7—Polling Station: Fire Station, 13 Mile road**  
Bounded on the north: by 14 Mile road, west: by Bingham Farms Village, south: by a line halfway between 12 and 13 Mile roads from Bingham Farms easterly to Evergreen, thence southerly to a line halfway between 11 and 12 Mile roads, thence easterly and northerly along the Lathrup city limits to 12 Mile road, thence easterly to Southfield road, east: by Southfield road.

**Precinct No. 8—Polling Station: Southfield high school, 10 Mile and Lahser roads**  
Bounded on the north: by a line halfway between 10 and 11 Mile roads from Northwestern highway west to a line halfway between Lahser and Berg roads, east: by a line halfway between Evergreen road and Lahser road, running south from Northwestern highway to the center of Section 27, then east to the western boundary of Duns Scotus college, thence southerly to Nine Mile road, thence westerly to Prescott, and south on Prescott to Eight Mile road, south: by Eight Mile road, west: by a north-south line that includes Charwood, but excludes Plattsburg, through the center of Plum Hollow golf course to a line halfway between Nine and 10 Mile roads, then west to the center of Section 28, thence north on the section line to 10 Mile road, south: by Eight Mile road west of Charwood to the Rouge river, thence northwesterly following the Rouge river to Inkster, west: by Inkster road.

**Precinct No. 9—Polling Station: Fire station, Nine Mile and Prosper**  
Bounded on the north: by a line halfway between Nine and 10 Mile road but excluding Samoset trail, east: by a north-south line that includes Charwood but includes Plattsburg, through the center of Plum Hollow golf course to a line halfway between Nine and 10 Mile roads, then west to the center of Section 28, thence north on the section line to 10 Mile road, south: by Eight Mile road west of Charwood to the Rouge river, thence northwesterly following the Rouge river to Inkster, west: by Inkster road.

**Precinct No. 10—Polling Station: Southfield-10 school, 25040 Berg road**  
Bounded on the north: by 11 Mile road, east: by Northwestern from 11 Mile to Lahser and south on Lahser to 10 1/2 Mile road, thence west on 10 1/2 Mile road to the center of Section 21, thence south on the section line excluding Mulberry street in Section 28 but including all of Valley View, south: by a line halfway between Nine and 10 Mile road from the center of Section 28 to Inkster road but including all of Samoset trail, west: by Inkster road.

**Precinct No. 11—Polling Station: East Southfield school, 28501 Pierce road**  
Bounded on the north: by Webster road east: by Greenfield road south: by 10 1/2 Mile west: by Lathrup city limits and Southfield road.

**Precinct No. 12—Polling Station: Magnolia school, 17050 Lorset**  
Bounded on the north: by Nine Mile road, east: by Greenfield road, south: by Eight Mile road, west: by Stahelin road.

**Precinct No. 13—Polling Station: Peace American Lutheran Church, 13 Mile and Pierce**  
Bounded on the north: by Beverly road, east: by Greenfield road, south: by Webster road, west: by Southfield road.

### Lathrup

**Precinct No. 1—Polling Station: Lathrup school**  
Located west of Southfield road and north of 11 Mile road.

**Precinct No. 2—Polling Station: Lathrup school**  
Located east of Southfield road and south of 11 Mile road.

### Bingham Farms and Franklin Village

**Precinct No. 5—Polling Station: Franklin Community Hall, 32707 Franklin road**  
Includes all of the residents in both villages.

### Bloomfield Township

**Precinct No. 1—Polling Station: Bloomfield township offices, 4210 Telegraph**  
Bounded on the north: by the south side of Square Lake road and the north Section line of Section 7, east: by Adams road, south by north side of Quarton, west: by Inkster.

**Precinct No. 2—Polling Station: Bloomfield Village fire hall, Broadway boulevard at Lahser**  
Bounded on the north: by the south side of Quarton and Big Beaver roads, east: by Adams, south: by 14 Mile road, west: by the east side of Lahser road.

## Subdivisions Core Of Community Life In North Adams

North Adams is one of the fastest growing areas around Birmingham. Within the past four years, eight subdivisions have come into existence and as they develop, subdivisions organize associations as a minor governmental unit and bring about friendly associations with neighbors. Social outings and community events are planned by association board of directors.

Thornwood, when completed, will be one of the largest subdivisions in the North Adams area. It is located near Big Beaver and Adams roads. Clifford Mezey, is acting chairman, and James Everett, acting secretary, until an association is formed.

LEONARD LANE subdivision, located on the east side of Adams road, has had an association for the past three years. Several social and community events are planned each year including a dinner-dance at Birmingham Community House and a community Christmas tree for the children.

Association officers are Robert Wilson, president; Paul Taylor, vice president; Alan Yates, secretary and William McCurdy, treasurer.

Pine Hill association has planned many social events for their residents who are located north of Wattles road. The association is four years old and officers, elected in the spring of the year, are Charles De Pudy, president; John Holland, vice president; Roland Smith and Martin Linnbach, secretary and Koppie Homestead, secretary.

SHARING CROSS ESTATES north of Big Beaver and west of Adams road is another of the many growing subdivisions in the area. The association, newly formed, held an October election of officers at the Birmingham Community House.

An association square dance, to be held this month, will take place after a general association meeting at Vaughan school.

HICKORY HEIGHTS subdivision north of Wattles road and west of Adams road, formed an association last spring. Its officers are Warren Wood, president; Lawrence Price, vice president; Harry Finson, secretary and Lawrence Hess, treasurer.

Eastover Farms, another new community, extending north of Long Lake road, Bloomfield Hills, is expected to grow at a fast rate since a new school, Eastover, has been built within its area. Noel Fibbert is president of Eastover Farms, secretary and Joe Ackerman, vice president.

KENTWOOD, north of Long Lake road presently is forming an association. An election of officers is scheduled this week.

Charwood, bounded by Adams, Long Lake and Coolidge roads, consists of three subdivisions. Officers for the two-year old association are Keith Jenkins, president; James Lowe, vice president; Robert Mead, secretary and Charles Cox, treasurer.

### Bloomfield Hills

**Precinct No. 1—Polling Station: Bloomfield Hills fire hall, 45 E. Long Lake road**  
Boundaries: Precinct No. 1 lies north of a line which follows Vaughan road from Lahser to north boundary of Cranbrook foundation, thence easterly along the Cranbrook foundation north boundary to Cranbrook road, then northeasterly to Woodward, thence southeast to the east city limits.

**Precinct No. 2—Polling Station: St. Dunstan's Playhouse, Lone Pine road**  
Precinct No. 2 lies south of the line described above.

### Troy

**Precinct No. 1—Polling Station: City Hall, 60 W. Wattles road**  
Bounded on the north: by East Long Lake from Adams to Rochester roads east: by the west side of Rochester road from East Long Lake to Wattles road, thence west to a line halfway between Wattles road from Rochester road to a line halfway between Rochester and Livernois, thence southerly to the center of Section 22, thence westerly to the west boundary of Helen road, thence southerly to 16 Mile road, thence westerly to Livernois, then southerly to Radler street, south: by city limits of Royal Oak, Clawson and Birmingham; west, by Adams road

**Precinct No. 2—Polling Station: Fire Hall at 2780 Rochester Road**  
Bounded on the north: by the south side of Wattles road from Dequindre to John R.; east, by Dequindre road; west, by John R.; east, by Dequindre road, by E. Long Lake road; east, by Dequindre from E. Long Lake road to a line halfway between Dequindre to John R., thence south on John R. to the north side of Brinston, thence west on a line with Brinston to Stephenson highway, thence due south to Clawson city limits; south, Clawson city limits; west, Livernois from Clawson to Big Beaver road, thence east to the west side of Helen, thence north to a line even with Troywood road, thence east almost to Jennings, thence north to Wattles road, thence east to Rochester road, thence north to E. Long Lake road

**Precinct No. 3—Polling Station: Number 2 Fire Hall, 5930 Livernois road**  
Bounded on the north, by South boulevard; east, by Dequindre; south, by Long Lake road; west, by Adams road

**Precinct No. 4—Polling Station: Community building, 2375 E. Maple road**  
Bounded on the north: by Wattles road; east, by Dequindre; south, by 14 Mile road; west, by Wattles to the south side of Brinston, thence west to Stephenson highway, thence due south to the 14 Mile road.

### West Bloomfield Township

**Precinct No. 7—(which includes Walnut Lake and neighboring area) Polling Station: Walnut Lake fire hall, 1 block north of Walnut Lake road**  
Bounded on the north: by a line dividing section 13 and 24, east: by Inkster road, south: by 14 Mile road, west: by a line halfway between Middlebelt and Orchard Lake roads, from 14 Mile to just north of Walnut Lake road, thence easterly containing a small part of the southeast corner of Section 23, thence north on the dividing line between Sections 23 and 24 to Lone Pine road

**Precinct No. 3 (Pine Lake area) Polling Station: Sylvan Realty Co. office, Sylvan Center, Orchard Lake and Middlebelt roads**  
Bounded on the north: by Woodrow Wilson and Orchard Lake roads, east: by township limits, south: by the dividing line between Sections 12 and 13, west: by the dividing line between Sections 11 and 12, excluding Driveway road.

**Precinct No. 1—Polling Station: West Bloomfield township hall, 4460 Orchard Lake road**  
Bounded on the north: by the Grand Trunk railroad tracks from Pine Lake Country club to the township's western limits, excluding a small area in Sections 19 and 20, east: by a line halfway between Orchard Lake road and Middlebelt from 14 Mile to just north of Walnut Lake road, thence east to the dividing line between Sections 23 and 24, thence north on this line to Lone Pine road, thence due east to Inkster road, thence north to the dividing line between Sections 12 and 13, thence east along this line to the dividing line between Sections 11 and 12, thence north on this line to the Grand Trunk railroad tracks, south: by 14 Mile road, west: by Haggerty road.

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
