Ruth Edgar Shain, conductor of the Ruth Shain International Affairs class jointly sponsored by the AAUW, Birmingham branch, and the Birmingham Women's club will be honored at a breakfast, Tuesday, Nov. 6, at 9:15 a.m. at the Community House.

Mrs. Shain recently returned from the Paris Conference of the International Federation of University Women and will give a first-hand report on European and world news. The talk will also serve as a session for her International Affairs class.

Mrs. Shain, Birmingham civic leader and a frequent Paris visitor will, in addition, give her impressions of Paris, recent changes there, and of the Conference, to which she served as a non-voting delegate.

Forty-seven countries were represented at this meeting of University Women, according to Mrs. Shain, each with a diversity of customs and language . . . but each with a similar cultural background.

Despite the language barrier . . . most proceedings were of necessity in French . . . the major objective, that of International Fellowships were speedily accomplished.

May I introduce myself?

I was born in Birmingham, Oakland County, Michigan, attended high school there, also Detroit Central High and the University of Detroit. I was recognized on the second All-American team in football in 1917 and served with the United States Navy in World War I.

I am married. Mrs. Allen and I live in Waterford Township. We have one daughter and one son who served in World War II with the Eighth Air Force, completing nineteen missions over Germany.

I have always been active in Veterans affairs as well as other civic activities. I am Americanism Chairman of the Pontiac Lodge of Elks No. 810, Past Treasurer of the Oakland County Sportsmen's Club, Past President of the Oakland County Veterans and Historical Society, former President of the County Clerk's Association of the State of Michigan and served eight years as Secretary of the Association. I was instrumental in calling the first meeting on the Wisner Memorial Stadium and athletic field, which came to a successful conclusion. Also, I was honored by the Boys' Club of Pontiac as the "father of the year" in 1943.

I employ five young men, all ex-G.I.'s who are doing a swell job for this office and for Oakland County.

May I call your attention to some of our latest accomplishments?

I have installed a new record system covering births, deaths, marriages and naturalization. This system has been highly respected since installation in Oakland County and has been adopted by sixty-two of the eighty-three counties in the State of Michigan. I have also installed modern cash registers in both record and legal divisions which give an accurate account of each day's receipts, simplifying auditing.

In cooperation with the fact-finding committee employed by the Board of Supervisors, I have installed a single card index system for assumed names, co-partnerships and corporations. By streamlining these records approximately \$1800.00 has been saved in equipment each year.

In approximately six and one-half years, with the aid of the Legislature and acts of the Board of Supervisors, this office has increased its revenue to \$37,500.00. As this pamphlet goes to press, three additional items have been added which will further increase the above sum, which will accomplish a balanced budget.


I have requested microfilming of records of Oakland County as a protection against fire and other hazards. This will give more room in our already overcrowded vaults and save thousands of dollars in additional equipment. This matter is now in the hands of the Supervisor's Committee and the Board of Auditors for study. A contract for microfilming, dated August 12, 1956, has now been signed by the Board of Auditors to accomplish this work.

I have been able to keep pace with the ever-growing population of Oakland County by the use of an educational program which pays dividends in the hands of the legal profession and citizens of the County and spells economy to the taxpayers.
