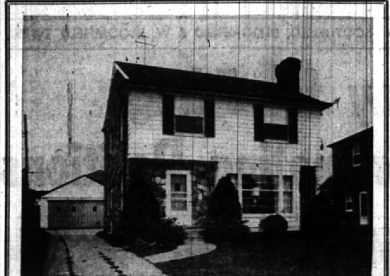

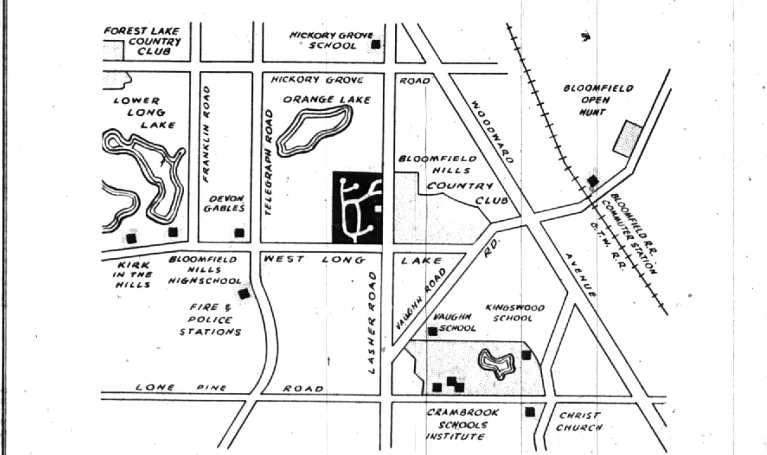
Discuss Moving Of Playground Equipment

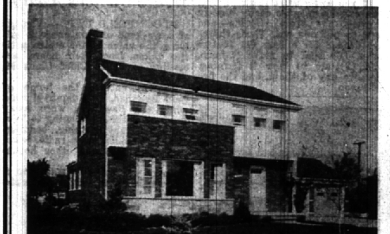
