Fraser's Aerial Attack Beats B'fld Hill's Bid

In their last league game of the season which was for the Southeastern Suburban conference crown, the Bloomfield Hills Barons fought a tightly-contested battle with Fraser before losing in the last two minutes of play. One touchdown—a desperate 22-yard aerial—spelled the difference in the 14-7 defeat.

With two games still remaining on their schedule, the Barons have now compiled a 4-2 record, still much improved over their 1-6 performance of last year. Looking ahead, coach Don Hoff has plenty to worry about, since he meets an Ironville squad again presenting a threatening passing attack.

THE FIRST HALF of last Friday's ballgame was a stalemate as both teams had trouble in grouping together an effective offense. The Barons were able to move well on occasions but penalties nullified their gains. Altogether the little red flags accounted for 75 yards against the Hillers.

In the third period, Fraser came to life and drove down into Bloomfield territory. Several plays later, Jim Munio flip a short 14-yard pass to Jerry Smith for the score. The kick was good, 7-0.
