## Adams Pupils Prepare for Open House



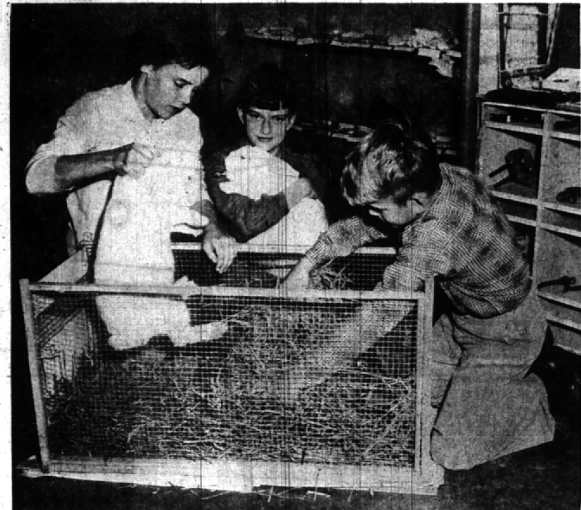
