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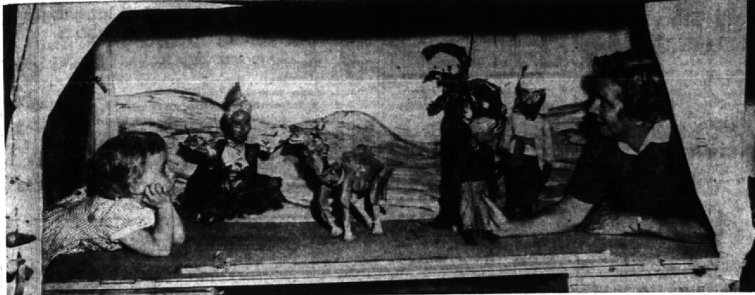

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Safety Measures Discussed By Pierce PTA

Problems of traffic safety, revision of PTA by-laws and consideration of property rezoning near the school, were the main topics of discussion at Pierce PTA meeting Monday evening.

A report from the special safety committee, appointed to investigate traffic problems near Pierce school, was presented. It contained detailed recommendations for location of student crossings, and places where parents should stop to discharge and pick up children. It was decided the safety committee would prepare a brochure outlining these recommendations, and distribute copies to all children.

Robert Walker reported that parents living south of 14 Mile road, whose children attend Pierce school are raising money to pay for a crossing guard at 14 Mile road and Pierce street.

Proposed revisions of the by-laws of Pierce PTA was discussed. They concern distribution of the dues, the authorized list of officers and duties of the mother vice-president and of the ways and means chairman. It was decided to poll the members of the PTA next spring for ideas for a fund raising project.

It was voted to send a letter to the City Commission putting Pierce PTA on record as objecting to rezoning the lot on Pierce between 14 Mile road and Bird street, from residential terrace to business "C". Members of the PTA feel rezoning this lot to business "C" would increase traffic near Pierce school, thereby creating an additional student safety problem.

Pierce PTA will hold its Open House tonight at 8 p.m. in conjunction with National Education Week. There will be a short business meeting, after which parents may visit their children's rooms, where exhibits and samples of their work will be displayed.
