Neighbors of the Thomas Ferrills of South Clunbury road are still reminiscing on the gay party which the Ferrills recently gave in their large lower level activities room.

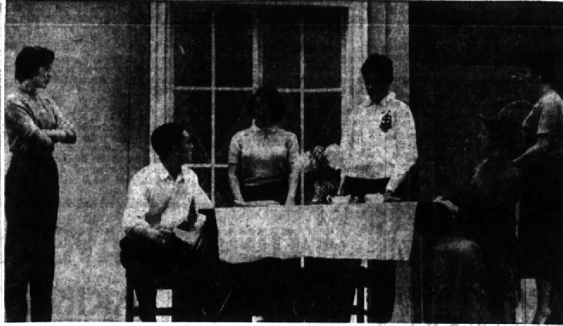
