



Weavers Hold Workshop In Bloomfield Hills Home

Stanley Zielinski, a renowned weaver from Montreal and author of "Master Weaver" led the workshop of the Michigan Weavers' guild last week at the home of Mrs. Carl H. Zuber, Squirrel road, Bloomfield Hills.

Two hours each day were devoted to lecture and design and the rest of the day spent on weaving and techniques by Mr. Zielinski's 20 students.

EVERY day last week, except Thursday, this schedule was followed when Mrs. Zuber hosted 50 weavers at tea.

Looms belonging to the students were brought to Mrs. Zuber's for the week-long workshop and threaded with advance instructions sent by the instructor. Among their new techniques were several modern weaves designed from old ones.

Mr. Zielinski, a graduate in electronic engineering, was director of a permanent exhibit of arts and crafts in Switzerland until the war. Since 1946 he has concentrated on weaving entirely.

THE SEVEN year old group meets once a month at the Woman's City club for an exchange of ideas. They were organized because of individual interests and to further the good of weaving.

Each weaver has a specialty of their own and they range from linens, placemats, fabrics for decorators, yardages, clothes, including men's sports jackets, evening bags, hats and an altar piece which was Mrs. Zuber's specialty.
