Minutes of the Special Meeting of the Township Board, held at the Southfield Township Hall, Located at 26080 Berg Road, November 8, 1956.

PRESENT: Alberton, Adams, Lane, Swanson, Svern, Wagner.
ABSENT: None.
Supervisor Swem called the meeting to order at 8:00 P.M.
Mr. Swem stated that the Special Meeting of the Township Board had been called to discuss the sale of the Bonds on the South-hampton Sewer project.
Mrs. Adams informed the Board members that the Bonds were advertised in the Four Corners Press and the Michigan Investor; the latter paper's ad was put in by Mr. Brown of Miller Canfield Paddock & Stone.

A telephone call was received from Mr. Hitchman of Kenower MacArthur Company to the effect that if there were no bids, he would be glad to work with the Township Board and see if the Bonds could be made more saleable.

Mr. W. E. Sherman, 17551 Addison, representing the Southhampton Civic Association, said that he had put the proposition up to the group, of financing the Bonds themselves, and better than 75% had said that they would pay the full assessment.

In response to Mr. Sherman's inquiry, Mrs. Adams informed him that the Bonds are tax free, Bonds bearing interest at 4%. The first payment will be due November 13, 1956. The contract has already been let to Peterson Brothers and they can start 30 days after the contract is signed. If Mr. Sherman can show the members of the Board, at the next meeting, that the people can finance the sale of the Bonds themselves, work can begin immediately.

MOTION by Adams, seconded by Wagner, that the Board adjourn the meeting, as far as the sale of Bonds is concerned, pending further investigation, until the Regular meeting of the Township Board on November 13, 1956.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT—(Santa Barbara and Lafayette, paving)

Mrs. Adams informed the Board that the Engineers had called and told her that they had received a call from the Road Commission giving a release and that it would be all right to advertise. This would be done on the 15th and the 22nd of November.

MOTION by Wagner, seconded by Alberton, that the Special Hearings for these two Special Assessment Districts; namely, Santa Barbara and Lafayette Streets, be set for Tuesday, November 27, 1956. Motion carried.

Mr. Swanson asked to be excused from the 27th meeting and was granted permission.

WATER DEBT SERVICES—J. B. Mylens, 21540 Negaunee.

Refer to Township Board Minutes of September 18, 1956, at which time Motion was made and passed to pay the remaining Debt Service charges against 21540 Negaunee from the Welfare Funds.

MOTION by Lane, seconded by Alberton that the bill of \$34.45 and Debt Service Bill of \$20.04 be paid from the Welfare Funds. Motion carried.

SOUTHFIELD BANKING FACILITIES
Miss Lane broached the subject of Southfield property owners being able to pay their taxes at the Bank as well as at the Township Hall.

MOTION by Swanson, seconded by Wagner, that this subject be tabled until the next regular meeting of the Board on November 13, 1956. Motion carried.

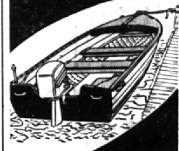
