 The class will reconvene Jan. 15 at 10 a.m.

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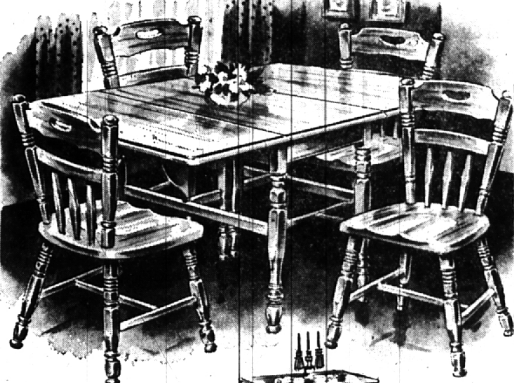
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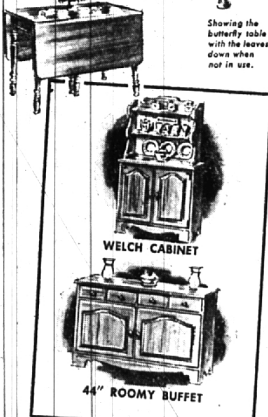
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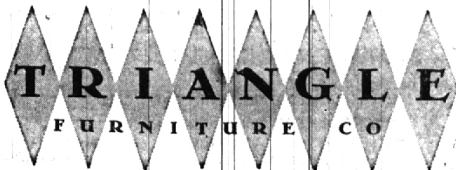
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
