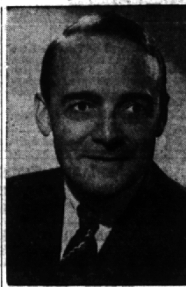
Brownies Bowl

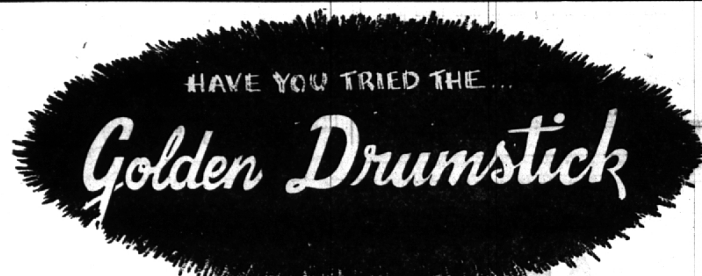
