There'll be no parking between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on sections of three heavily travelled downtown Birmingham streets.

City commissioners approved permanent daytime restrictions for the east side of Bates, from Martin to Maple; east side of Chester, Maple to Willets; and north side of Maple, Chester to Southfield. Thirty-minute meters will go on the east side of Bates, Maple to Willets, but there will be no parking at any time on either side of Willets from Woodward to Chester.
