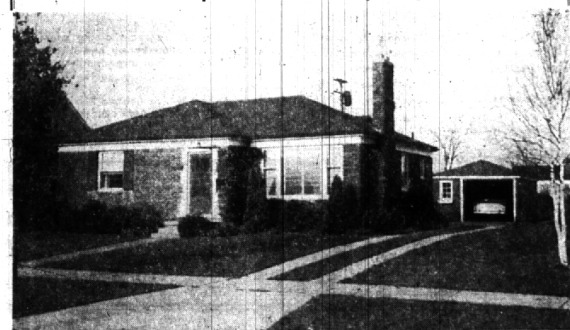

City's Sewer Profile Maps Out of Pocket

LATHRUP — City council is having trouble finding profile maps of the city's sewer system. They claim that the Charles D. Kelley, who had the sewers installed, either have the maps or the maps are in the possession of Kelley's engineers, Ayers, Lewis, Norris and May. Ann Arbor engineers who have done engineering for the Kelleys for some time. Kelley says, however, that the maps were turned over to Earl Clark, county drain commissioner eight years ago when the county assumed control of the sewers. PRESENT drain commissioner, Ralph A. Main says he does not have the maps. City Council wants the maps because they are about to assume responsibility for the city's sewer system as soon as they iron out differences in a quit-claim deed they are negotiating with the Kelleys. A member of the firm of Fate and Hirt, engineers doing work for Lathrup, told council members that a principal in the Ayers, Lewis, Norris and May firm has stated he would turn the profile maps over to Fate and Hirt upon approval of Kelley. AND KELLEY, at the last regular council meeting, when asked by Councilman Frederick O. Johnson if he would give that okay to the Ann Arbor engineers, would not come up with a "yes" or "no" answer.

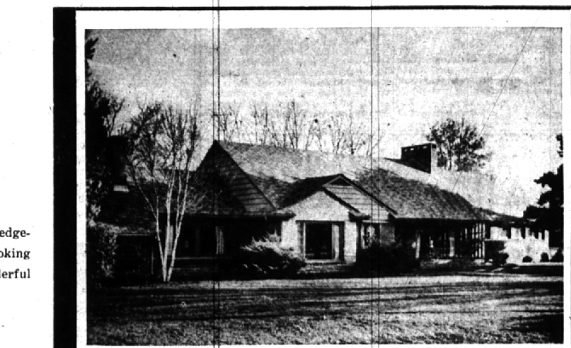
