Rainfall during the last two months has been 4 1/2 inches below normal. The ground is really dry. If the ground thaws again in December WATER, WATER and WATER the evergreens until the ground freezes, then cover the ground with mulch and use screens or windbreaks to protect younger plants to conserve the moisture.
