Request Sewer, Water Services For Troy Firms

If a West Maple Industrial firm will meet Birmingham's contract terms, it will get sewer service—perhaps water, too.

Troy City Manager O. C. Holway asked Birmingham city commissioners Monday night to extend sewer service to B-W Controller Co., a Troy firm immediately outside Birmingham corporate limits that Troy cannot serve.

Holway also asked Birmingham to temporarily serve the Kuhlman Electric Co., east of Coolidge road, with water pending Troy's purchase agreement for Walker water supply some months from now.

For their final approval, Birmingham's managers asked their city manager, Harold Schone, to negotiate sewer contract terms with B-W Controller and water purchase agreement with Holway.

Bank agreement with Henry L. (Dubuque) S. Henrietta, to acquire and remodel his building at the northwest corner of Pierce and Martin, across from the Birmingham city hall.

"WE ALSO have been able to add E. W. Nelson, 4202 Sheridan, Henry Hills, former Michigan state banking Commissioner, and Clifford G. Haseberger, 1495 W. Lincoln, to our committee," reported Wilson.

"They take the place of Don Sammings and Carson Bingham, who asked to be relieved of their assignment last week. By next week we hope to announce the name of the man we plan to appoint as executive head of the new bank."

Another local group, of considerable financial substance, looking into plans for a new bank, informed The Eccentric it expects to make a decision on the subject within a very short time. It, too, is canvassing the community for men to serve on its board of directors.

"NOW THAT our first goal appears to be achieved, we're shooting for the second one—the all-time record of \$219,629 set last year. We have every hope that this can be reached, if it is possible for 1,400 volunteers to complete their door-to-door, business-to-business canvass."
