

R. O. Kiwanians Volunteer to Serve At Local GOC Post

New supervisor of the Birmingham Grand Observer post is Mrs. Kenneth Ives, of 118 Columbia, Birmingham, and a men's service club has volunteered to stand watches at the post.

Mrs. George Ives of Milford, area civil defense director, said this week that Mrs. Ives' chief observer will be Mrs. S. S. Nathan, of 31290 Old Trail, Franklin.

First men's service club to volunteer to be responsible for the post's sky-watching on a given night, Mrs. Eberle announced, is the Royal Oak Kiwanis club. The 60 men will go on duty from midnight until 8 a.m. Saturdays, with two men standing two-hour watches together.

Meeting with them at midnight tomorrow, Mr. and Mrs. Eberle will serve with and train men on duty that evening. They, in turn, will train remaining members.

Street Foreman Can Catch Up On Lost Sleep

After 3 1/2 years as Birmingham's street foreman, Willard M. Brown can at last be sure that no middle-of-the-night calls will rouse him from bed. For Brown, 65, of 868 Hazel, Birmingham, has retired from his municipal job.

He can remember many a night when heavy snow, sleet, or flooding conditions brought calls to the street foreman to get emergency crews to work.

He can remember, too, that when he became street foreman of the village of Birmingham in April, 1925, the now-mechanized snow and dirt removal was done by hand.

Working under eight Birmingham Department of Public Works superintendents, Brown was largely responsible for the good work and supervision of the city's present roadbuilding program.

IT WAS BROWN who suggested the city's present successful system of oiling and seal coating the same year.

Now that he has put aside his responsibility for keeping Birmingham's streets in good repair, the veteran city employee and his wife plan to make a leisurely trip to visit relatives in Colorado. From here they'll satisfy a longtime urge to visit Florida.

They'll also spend some time at a summer home in Port Austin, Mich.

Back in Birmingham, Brown's former assistant, Irwin Harrison, has taken over the street foreman's duties.

CITY COMMISSIONERS recently issued a special resolution expressing the appreciation of the city's administrative staff and its citizens for "Mr. Brown's faithful and efficient performance of his duties."

And for the first time in 3 1/2 years, they'll let him sleep peacefully when the streets need fixing in the middle of the night.

After reporting at the Birmingham police station that she had been struck by a backing automobile in the municipal parking lot, about 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, Jeanne Williams, of 3081 N. Adams road, fainted a few moments later at Riello's restaurant, 195 W. Maple.

The hit-and-run victim told police she thought the car which struck her was a white Cadillac. She said she was unable to get up for about ten minutes after the accident.

Hospital authorities said she suffered a mild concussion and was released after examination.

Pleading guilty to charges of driving under the influence of liquor, Frank A. Szejanowski, 28, of Detroit, was fined \$85 and \$15 costs Friday by Birmingham Municipal Judge John J. Gaffill. Szejanowski was ordered to turn his driver's license over to be retained by the state for 90 days.

Szejanowski was arrested by Birmingham police in December, 1954, and charged with driving under the influence of liquor when tried in Birmingham justice court.
