Refreshments will be served by the fourth and sixth grade room mothers.

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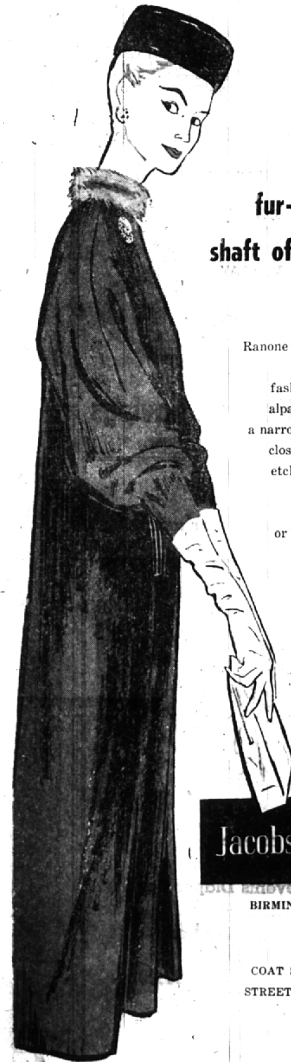


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
