

Open House, Teachers' Reception Highlights Education Week

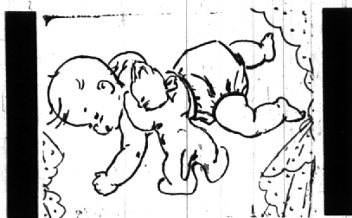
