

# Parties Original

How many mothers take a dim view of giving parties for their children? There must be many as it is not uncommon to hear a mother exclaim, "Never again!"

If you have felt this, or even said it, stop and think why. The reason does not lie with your child nor with his friends. It is rather with you, yourself.

Here are the reasons. First, perhaps you didn't put enough time into preparation of the party. Remember, your child's party is as important or perhaps even more important than many you give for your adult friends.

YOUR CHILD is establishing his social foundation, learning to be a host, putting down his social roots and establishing himself with his circle of friends.

You are his sponsor in this important part of his life. Make his party distinctive, well organized and lots of fun. If you spend time with it, it will run smoothly and both you and he will be proud of its success.

SECOND keep the upper hand and remain in control of the party at all times. Do not let them get out of hand and in poor discipline. This is up to you.

Children are spontaneous and excitable but if you understand this, you can tell when they are getting out of hand. Change the game, have the main offender assist you with something or just say a few plain words to all. They

will respect you for it and all will have a better time.

THIRD, do not get engrossed in conversation with some other adult at the party or with some kitchen preparation and leave the party unattended. If you do, it is your own fault when things get out of hand. Your kitchen preparations should have been planned and done before-hand.

Fourth, have plenty of games so that they are not doing the same thing too long. Children tire or get restless very easily.

Fifth be prepared for noise, jumping and running, squeals, giggles and screams. Are you such a bundle of nerves that you can't take it? Then see your doctor but don't blame the children.

AS YOU READ the column this time, it may sound stringent. If so, it is meant to be, so you possibly will be brought up by the bootstraps to realize that his very own parties are one of the most important things you do for your child.

The parties will be remembered by him all of his life and because they were happy times, he will want his children to have nice parties. Children from eight years and on should assist with the plans and execution of the party. They should choose and prepare the invitations, greet their guests, assist with the games, bid their friends goodbye and help with picking up after the party.

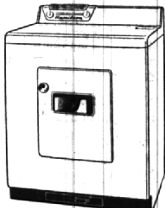
