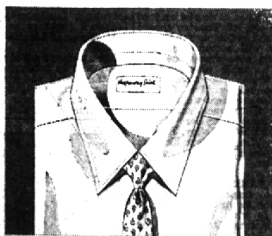

Local UN Week Plans Announced

Recently appointed by Mayor James C. Allen to be chairman of United Nations week locally, Mrs. Robert Applegate, of 1965 Ston Road, this week announced plans for the Oct. 17 through 24 observance.

At the same time she revealed that the Birmingham League of Women Voters is reactivating a United Nations speakers' bureau. League member Mrs. Winston Kellogg, of 1879 Northlawn, will be able to make speakers available to groups when contacted.

The League of Women Voters will also mark UN week with the presentation of a children's book shelf on the United Nations to the Birmingham board of education. Miss Ann Mock, in charge of materials and curriculum, will make the UN books available to classrooms.

ON OCT. 25 a panel will discuss "Should membership in the UN be universal?" when it meets at Torrey school at 8 p.m. Participating in the open panel discussion will be William S. Broomfield, Republican candidate for U.S. Congress, Paul Sutton, Democratic candidate for the same office, Russell Barnes of the Detroit News, and Mrs. Frederic Weidner of Dearborn.

Birmingham city commissioners Monday night okayed the expenditure by the city of \$100 to provide UN literature to be distributed in local banks.

Tire and Wheel Thefts Admitted By Four Youths

Four youths who admitted the theft of 15 tires and wheels in Birmingham and surrounding communities were arraigned last night in Birmingham municipal court.

Robert Stewart, 24, of Ulica, pleaded guilty to charges of simple larceny and was fined \$25 and \$10 costs. He was ordered by Judge John J. Gaffill to make restitution to the complainant, and placed on probation for one year.

Also ordered to make restitution and fined \$15 each were Kenneth W. Kelmar, 17, Robert P. Kelmar, 23, and Larry Eagling, 17, all of Rochester. The three were placed on one year's probation.

Birmingham police Det. Lt. Merlin Holmquist said the four admitted taking the tires and wheels from the trunks of automobiles and reselling them. Holmquist said they also admitted the theft of hub caps and other accessories.

Object to Reasoning If Parking Ties In

More than 50 residents of the Redding-Lakeside area see no reason for reasoning Woodward property if it means parking districts will be extended westward from the business frontage.

Through spokesman Thomas L. Conklin, their petition objected to a city plan board recommendation that present business A zoning be changed to business C with adjoining parking lots.

City commissioners continued the public hearing until Oct. 29, to permit city and subdivision representatives to meet, discuss the situation in greater detail.

Both business owners are willing to erect professional offices on their sites at the corners of Redding and Woodward, but only if the city will allow parking at the rear.

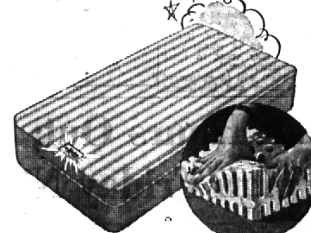
